State Council Day Board Meeting Saturday, March 3, 2018 Marriott Hotel, Indianapolis, IN.

President Lynn Anderson called the Board Meeting to order at 10:12 am in the Marriott Hotel in Indianapolis, Indiana. The following members were present: President Lynn Anderson; Vice President Judy Harris; Recording Secretary Martha Lamey; Treasurer Zelda Flye; Historian Cathy Hollis; Parliamentarian Yvonne Nace and Advisor Linda Smith.

President Lynn thanked everyone for being members of the State Board and for attending the Reception held for the new officers. She also announced the deaths of two of our sisters, Mary Daily and Linda Gilbert and of one sister's husband, Teressa Meredith. Lynn and Zelda went over the budget and copies were given to the board members. Lynn also gave the board copies of the updated State Committees list. Yvonne Nace made the motion that the Budget committee and the Advisory committee meet and go over costs for State Events. Cathy Hollis seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Vice President Judy Harris reported she contacted International for the name of a chapter to judge the Woman of the Year letters. The chapter is Wichita City Council, Wichita, Kansas. Judy will have the letters to them by Monday, August 20 and they will return them by September 7, 2018. Judy gave the secretary 210 copies of the Woman of the Year forms and guidelines to be mailed with the minutes of the State Day Minutes in June. Judy will need chapters to return the forms to her by August 15, 2018. Judy has also ordered the President's pin and should have it this weekend. She will order the Woman of the Year trophy as soon as she can contact Moe McQueary. Judy has the yellow delegate ribbons for the voting on Sunday.

Secretary Martha Lamey reported the minutes of the Fall Board meeting were sent along with the Business Meeting Minutes of 2017 State Convention. Also, the Registration packets for State Council Day 2018 were mailed. She also sent cards to Kim Keefer, Millie Allman, Dea Troxel, B.J. Cheeseman and Teressa Meredith. Martha said she would have a "change of address" form on the tables on Sunday. Copies of the Master Mailing List will be ready for the Past Presidents on Sunday. She has two members ready to move the dispensing of reading of the minutes.

Treasurer Zelda Flye gave her report. Copies will be mailed with the minutes. She handed out copies of the form to request payment, copies of the form to pay Chapter State dues and copies of the chapters who have paid their due to date. The dues form will also be included with the minutes. Zelda gave copies of the Check Book register, Financial Statement, Budget and State Project Account to the Board.

Historian Cathy Hollis announced she would like to have the pictures and items for the President's Memory Book in to her by August 24, 2018. This date is early because State Convention is in September this year instead of October. She shared the letter she is placing on the tables on Sunday outlining the items she would like to have for the book. She also requested a booth at State Council Day to raise some extra funds to use toward the making of the memory book. She will have a contest to see which chapter can send in the most pictures and win a prize. The History has been updated and will be posted on the website. Cathy asked about using Walgreens for pictures and was told no as the site charges to get the pictures.

The hotel staff informed us that lunch was ready, so we took a break at 12:00 Noon. After a lovely lunch, President Lynn called the meeting back to order at 12:34 pm.

Parliamentarian Yvonne Nace presented her report. She has some By-Law books but there are items to be voted on at the meeting on Sunday, so she is waiting to see if there needs to be any updating. She is prepared to read the Article concerning By-Law change and to read the proposed change. Yvonne has six tellers lined up to count the ballots.

Advisor Linda Smith stated she has ordered the Proclamation, but it has not yet appeared. She will get copies to Martha as soon as it arrives. It will be included in the mailing. She asked if help was needed working the booth tomorrow. And now for her words of wisdom:

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Convention 2017, Bea Smith & Yvonne Nace reported their books are closed. A copy of their report will be included with the minutes.

State FHA, Bea Smith and committee events are filled thru 2020, with the exception of State Council Day 2020. Bea hopes to fill it tomorrow.

State Council Day 2018, Beth Eskew & Carrie Alford reported on this weekend festivities. Beth reported on some of the problems they encountered and how they were solved. She stressed the importance that each chairman of each event give a DETAILED budget including what was budgeted, what the actual cost was and what was donated (include taxes & fees). This would

help each event host to plan for expenses and adjust where needed. They will have tables set for registration. One for delegates and one for non-delegates.

State Fun Day/State Day 2018, Peggy Wood & Marguerite De Vore presented the flyer that will be on the tables tomorrow. They also asked for approval of the registration packet. The ways and means form was not included, but will be sent to the Board for approval. The two events will be held at the Hilton Garden Inn, Edinburgh, Indiana on June 23 and June 24. The registration fee for State Fun Day is \$20.00 and the registration fee for State Day is \$40.00. The hotel rooms are \$124.00 and includes breakfast. The Registration packets will be mailed out the first of April. There will NOT be a charge for Ways & Means Booths. The Board discussed the dress code for State Fun Day and State Day. Since the theme is "Summer in the City" it was decided to wear pastel colors, scarfs and sunglasses.

State Convention 2018, Myra Albrecht and Patti Mitchum announced the Convention will be held at the Holiday Inn Indianapolis Airport and the theme is New York, New York! Registration is \$145.00, and the rooms are \$109.00. Registration packets will go out after State Day. They also asked that the flowers for the State Woman of the Year and runner-up be paid for by the State. There is no money in the state budget for the expense, since it has always been paid for by the event's host. The Board suggested reducing the number of flowers given to the winner and the runner-up to help with expenses.

State Project ICADV, Sarah Dunn reported that State Project has booth #1 & #2. She suggested that out-of-town chapters might want to donate the skivvies they collect to a shelter in their area. This is acceptable. Just let Sarah know this is what you are doing so she can include them in the number collected. ICADV is NOT having a conference/auction this year – they are having a Night at the Races and a Gala at Lucas Estate. Therefore, they do not need Large baskets but will be able to use auction items such as gift cards, small baskets and electronics. Also, there will not be table sponsors. The dates are:

State Membership Committee, Barbara Coveleskie reported the committee met earlier today and discussed ideas for the coming year. One of their big ideas is a "new contest" to reward chapters that increase their membership. First the chapter must be a member of State Council, then the chapter must add the most new members from September 15, 2017 to August 15, 2018. That chapter could win \$100 which would be presented at Convention 2018. Now, to make it just a little more competitive, the chapter who brings in the most new members between September 15, 2017 and March 4, 2017 will win \$40.00 and the chapter who brings in the most new members between March 4, 2017 and August 15,

2018 will win \$40.00. This means that three different chapters could win or one chapter could win ALL three. So, ladies, it's time to get your grove on and get those new members! Forms will be included with the minutes.

Ways & Means Committee, Paula Myers & Candy Lindstrom reported they are ready for the Ways & Means tomorrow at State Council Day. They will be checking the booths to see they are selling the items they signed up for and will collect the winning tickets at the closing of the booths. It was suggested that a person receiving a booth at an event will be told if it is a full table or half table.

Website Teresa Stites & Nadine Cota reported they are looking into finding a friendlier platform for the website. They asked the members to be sure to let the website know things like their calendar of events, birthday, thinking of you, sympathy cards that need to be sent. It's a way to keep in touch! They also requested electronic copies of registration packets be sent to them.

State Advisory Committee Linda Smith reported the committee will try to meet before State Day and go over ideas with the **Budget Committee**. The two groups will try to come up with ideas to help us save money.

State Council Day 2019 Linda Smith reported the event will be held at the Embassy Suites Conference Center, 6089 Clark Creek Road, Plainfield, IN. Registration Fee \$45.00 and Room rates \$149.00 (includes breakfast, happy hour & Wi-Fi). Registration Cancellation Deadline is February 1, 2019. Linda gave a copy of the registration form to the board for approval. These will be sent after State Convention 2018. She also included a budget for this event.

Unfinished Business:

The two By-Law changes were discussed and will be discussed and voted on during the Business Meeting. The changes are: **Article IV, Section 4, Paragraph B** – Par B (a) Elections shall be by secret ballot. (b) All officers shall be elected in the manner herein provided, **except the Parliamentarian and Historian who shall be appointed by the President.** (c) Officers need not be chosen from the voting delegates.

Article VI, Section 1 – All Officers and Advisor's registration fees to Convention shall be paid for out of the State Council Treasury.

These changes will be read by Yvonne Nace, Parliamentarian, at the Business Meeting. She will call for discussion and then hand out the ballots for the vote.

New Business:

The Board was reminded that the deadline to submit letters for those running for State Office is Monday, May 1, 2018. The only office NOT open is treasurer. Zelda has it for one more year.

Linda Smith read a letter from Debbie Norris, Xi Alpha Mu, Terre Haute, IN. In it she sites **Article V, Meetings** and suggests the following change. **Section 1.** There shall be three Council meetings a year: State Council Day, State Day and State Convention. State Council Day shall be held in Indianapolis **or the adjoining counties**, each year on the first Sunday in March with various cities being hostesses. The place of meeting for State Day and State Convention shall be determined by the State Council voting members. Bids for all State meetings shall be determined by majority vote at State Convention.

This will be brought up at the Business meeting.

State Council Day Business Meeting Indianapolis Marriott North 3645 River Crossing Parkway March 4, 2018

A lovely lunch was served at 11:30 am and then Cindy Lanane from ICADV spoke to us on an update of what is going on and how Beta Sigma Phi has been and still is a great help to them. After Cindy spoke, we began with a moment of silence for our Sisters who have passed.

President Lynn Anderson called the meeting to order at 12:45 pm. She asked everyone to stand and repeat the Opening Ritual.

She thanked Beth Eskew, Alpha Epsilon—Washington, and her committee for all their hard work and a wonderful weekend and then asked Vice President Judy Harris for her report.

Vice President Judy Harris asked if all delegates were registered. She reported 62 delegates, 85 non-delegates, 7 state officers, and 3 guests for a total of 150 present. 4 Ritual of Jewel, 6 Exemplar, 7 Preceptor, 3 Laureate, 12 Master and 2 Torch Bearer for a total of 34 chapters.

Judy announced the Woman of the Year letters should be to her by August 15, 2018.

Secretary Martha Lamey asked for a motion to dispense with the reading of the Fall Board Meeting Minutes and accept them as mailed. Peggy Wood, Preceptor Delta Gamma, Indianapolis made the motion. Historian Cathy Hollis reported the History is being updated and should be on the website shortly. She is asking for pictures for the Memory Book for Lynn and she needs to have these by August 24, 2018 because Convention 2018 will be held in September. Cathy announced the Memory Book had a booth to help raise extra money for the book.

Parliamentarian Yvonne Nace thanked everyone for a lovely weekend and then she read the Constitution Articles on voting. There are two changes up for vote.

Article IV, Section 4, Paragraph B - Currently reads, Par B (a) Elections shall be by secret ballot. (b) All officers shall be elected in the manner herein provided, except the **Parliamentarian** who shall be appointed by the President. (c) Officers need not be chosen from the voting delegates.

Proposed change: Par B (a) Elections shall be by secret ballot. (b) All officers shall be elected in the manner herein provided, except the **Parliamentarian and Historian** who shall be appointed by the President. (c) Officers need not be chosen from the voting delegates.

The second article is **Article VI, Section 1** currently reads, All Officers and Advisor's registration fees for all **State Council Meetings** (State Council Day, State Day, and State Convention) shall be paid for out of the State Council Treasury.

Proposed change: All Officers and Advisor's registration fees to **Convention** shall be paid for out of the State Council Treasury. These will come up under new business.

Advisor Linda Smith reported on the cards that were sent to Lisa Blair & Nu Delta, sympathy cards on the passing of Shirley Blair; Millie Allman card on her 92nd birthday; Mary Karch a get well card; Teressa Meredith a card on the passing of her husband Roy; Dea Troxel and B.J. Chesseman thinking of you cards and Peggy Wood on her retirement.

State Event and Committee Reports

State Convention 2018 Myra Ablrecht and Patti Mitchum Co-Chairmen reported the Convention 2018 will be held at Holiday Inn at the Airport, Indianapolis. Date is September 28, 29 & 30. Registration is \$145.00 and the room rate is \$109.00. The flyer was on the tables and the packets will go out after State Day in June.

State Project ICADV Sarah Dunn Chairman reported the booth raised \$189.00 for Skivvies for Kiddies. She announced May 12th will be the Night At The Races and August 4th will be the Gala at Lucas Estates and June 2nd is Race Away from Domestic Violence. State Secondary Project Lamplighters Doris Moehlenkamp & Janet Neu Co-Chairmen reported on the financial state as Balance brought forward - \$4,046.09 Total deposits - \$1,513.27 Total disbursements - \$1,300.00 Checking account \$8.15 Total funds: \$4,267.51. Membership Committee Barbara Coveleskie Chairman reported she and her committee have decided to have a contest that will run between September 15, 2017 to August 15, 2018. The chapter must be a member of State Council and bring in the most new members during that time to win \$100.00. Also, a chapter can win \$40.00 by bringing in the most new members between State Council Day 2018 and State Day 2018. Then, a chapter can win \$40.00 for the most new members between State Day 2018 and State Convention 2018. The forms will be enclosed with the minutes.

Ways & Means Paula Myers and Candy Lindstrom Co-Chairmen reported the booths were all checked, and the winning tickets drawn, and the committee was ready to disburse the winning items. It was announced that chapters requesting booths in the future would be advised if they were sharing a table with another chapter, so their displays could be set accordingly.

Website Committee Theresa Stites and Nadine Cota Co-Chairmen asked if chairmen of events would send electronic flyers of their events, so they can be placed on the website. They also reported they were looking into a more friendly platform. They will keep us posted as to what they find.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Parliamentarian Yvonne Nace read Roberts Rules regarding discussions. There will be 15 minutes of discussion. The first person in favor then a person against and so on. Then the vote can be taken. The item under discussion is Article VI Section 1. Having to do with the payment of fees for State events. Eight members gave their opinions for and against the change. The 15 minutes having passed, the ballots were passed out, marked and collected by the tellers.

The delegates then received the ballots to vote on Article IV, Section 4, Par. B. There was no discussion as this was discussed at Convention 2017. The ballots were marked, collected by the tellers and then the tellers were excused to count the two different ballots. Results will be announced later in the meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Debbie Norris, President of Xi Alpha Mu, Terre Haute sent a letter dated January 29, 2018 to President Lynn Anderson requesting a change to Article V, Section 1, Meetings. This section currently states: There shall be three Council meetings a year; State Council Day, State Day and State Convention. State Council Day shall be held in Indianapolis each year on the first Sunday in March with various cities being hostesses. The place of meeting for State Day and State Convention shall be determined by the State Council voting members. Bids for all State meetings shall be determined by majority vote at State Convention.

The change requested is: There shall be three Council meetings a year; State Council Day, State Day and State Convention. State Council Day shall be held in Indianapolis or the adjoining counties, each year on the first Sunday in March with various cities being hostesses. The place of meeting for State Day and State Convention shall be determined by the State Council voting members. Bids for all State meetings shall be determined by majority vote at State Convention.

This change was requested because of the rising cost of hotels and the decrease in attendance. Xi Alpha Mu is involved in the planning of State Council Day 2019 and need this change to take place immediately. After some discussion and explanation, Bea Smith made the motion to grant an exception. Donna Perelle seconded the motion. President Lynn Anderson asked for the vote and the motion carried. The change will go into effect immediately.

The tellers came back, and President Lynn asked for the results of the votes. They are as follows: Article VI, Section 1 did not pass. Article IV, Section 4, Par. B did not pass.

President Lynn reminded the members anyone wishing to run for a State Office needs to have their letter in to her by May 1, 2018. The offices are: President, Vice President, Secretary, and Historian.

It is also time to vote on our State Project. ICADV is our current project. If you have other charities you would like to be considered, be sure to get your letter in. If you want to keep ICADV, then we still need to have a letter to that effect. May 1, 2018 is the deadline for this.

There being no further business to come before the members, President Lynn declared the meeting adjourned at 2:35 pm. The members stood for the Closing Ritual and Mizpah.

We then had the drawing for the booths and for the door prizes.

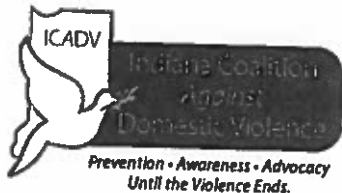
