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State Day Meeting Minutes Hilton Garden Inn Edinburgh, Indiana June 24, 2018

Indiana Beta Sigma Phi State Day Meeting was called to order at 12:47 pm by President Lynn Anderson.

President Lynn asked for a moment of silence for the sisters lost in the past year and for their family members. Candy Lindstrom lost her husband suddenly in June. Shirley Taylor, Alpha Upsilon Master Indianapolis pass away on Friday, June 23, 20018.

President Lynn Anderson introduced our guest speaker, Kerri Bennett, Attorney for Indiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence (ICADV). Kerri thanked everyone for inviting her and for the support Beta Sigma Phi gives to ICADV. She also told us that Jessica who also works at ICADV had a nine-pound baby girl on Saturday. Kerri explained her role with ICADV. She is attorney for 75 to 90 direct service providers of ICADV and helps train lawyers how to argue for victim's rights in court. Fighting for victims of domestic abuse in court is essential to help them break free of their abuser.

President Lynn asked for the reading of the minutes from the State Council Day n meeting. There were some corrections to the minutes as follows: 1) Under the Secretary's report, it was the reading of the Convention Business Meeting Minutes, not the Fall Board Meeting minutes. 2) Under the Treasurer's report, the Officer's Auction was held at the Summer and Fall Board Meetings, not the Convention Board Meeting. 3) Under New Business Article V, Section 1, Meetings, the request to change this Article will be rewritten and the new change will be voted on at State Convention. 4) An exception was requested and granted to hold State Council Day 2019 in Plainfield, IN. Arliss Barnes, Preceptor Delta Gamma moved the minutes be accepted as corrected and Sue Wilson, Xi Iota seconded the motion. Motion carried.

COMMUNICATIONS:

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

President Lynn Anderson said she has copies of the nominating letters for the coming election of officers: President, Vice President, Secretary and Historian. The Treasurer is beginning her second year of office.

Vice President Judy Harris asked if all delegates are registered. She reported there are 46 delegates, 62 non-delegates, 7 officers, 2 guests – Total 110 registered. Chapters registered: 0 Nu Phi Mu, 3 Ritual of Jewels, 5 Exemplar, 6 Preceptor, 1 Laureate, 7 Master, 3 Torchbearer – Total 27. The deadline for Woman of the Year letters is August 15, 2018. Debbie Kite Advisor Wichita City Council and members Wichita, Kansas, will be doing the judging. Copies of the Guidelines for Woman of the Year will be included with the minutes.

Recording Secretary Martha Lamey reported the bills for the mailing of State Council Day have been sent to the Treasurer. Copies of the Membership Roster is ready for the Past Presidents, the Committee Chairmen and the Board. There were some Past Presidents whose names were not on a Roster that was handed out earlier. This was because that list was used as a mailing list and they were no longer with us. Their names will be added back on the list of Past Presidents but will not be included in the mailing. There were corrections made to the State Council Day 2018 minutes. These were read and corrections approved.

Treasurer Zelda Flye presented the State day Financial Report. A copy of the Report is included with the minutes.

State Historian Cathy Hollis reported she has received pictures for the contest from two chapters. These two contestants are running neck and neck. The deadline to have these pictures in to qualify for the contest is August 31st. She also has envelopes on the tables so pictures can be mailed to her.

Parliamentarian Yvonne Nace Reported the Constitution and By-Laws are up to date and listed on the website. There have been no changes made to date.

Advisor Linda Smith reported cards were sent to Carol Higgins, Maria Boring, B.J. Cheeseman, Joyce Bunnell, Linda Hopkins and Kaye Barnett. Linda did not receive the Proclamation from the Governor. His office does not issue proclamations to individual groups. He recognizes the charity work that groups do.

FHA Committee Chairman, Bea Smith reported State Council Day 2019 will be hosted by Xi Alpha Mu, Terre Haute, State Fun Day and State Day will be hosted by Xi Eta Rho, Fort Wayne and State Convention 2019 will be hosted by Xi Alpha Pi, Evansville. State Council Day 2020 **DOES NOT HAVE A HOST**. State Fun Day and State Day 2020 will be hosted by Mary Greuter, Anderson and State Convention 2020 will be hosted by Preceptor Delta Delta, Ft. Wayne. Bea reminded us that we plan three (3) years out so we need members to step up.

State Fun Day & State Day 2018 Co-Chairmen Peggy Wood and Marguerite DeVore thanked everyone for all their hard work to make this weekend a success. Peggy called Sharon Russell to stand and everyone sang "Happy Birthday" to her!

State Council Day 2017 Chairman Beth Eskew reported their books are still open, but after the success their booth had at today's Ways & Means, they will be able to close them and be out of the red! Thanks to all who helped them out.

State Convention 2018 Chairman Myra Albrecht reported the registration packets for Convention 2018 went out early. Convention will be held at the Holiday Inn Airport. Registration is \$145.00 and the room rate is \$109.00. The dates are September 28, 29 & 30, 2018. Incorrect deadline dates were on the Ways & Means form. Myra will get a new form ready to go with the State Day minutes. The correction will be: **Ways & Means Deadline is August 28th** with notification two weeks later.

Co-chairman Patti Mitchum apologized for the mix up in the letters the committee sent asking chapters to pay their State dues. She had two different lists and some who were paid got a letter to pay. Convention will have a DJ for the Friday night party. Ways & Means will be Saturday with the formal dinner, awards and installation of officers on Saturday evening. Semi-formal wear is the order for Saturday evening. Zelda Flye will lead a service on Sunday morning followed by brunch and Closing Ritual using our legacy members.

State Convention 2017 Chairman Bea Smith turned in the final financial report for this event. Copies will be included with the minutes.

State Council Day 2019 Chairman Linda Smith reported the meeting will be held March 3, 2019 at the Embassy Suites Conference Center, 6089 Clarks Creek Road, Plainfield, IN. Registration is \$45.00 and room rate is \$149.00. The theme for this meeting is a "Baby Shower". Members are to bring a baby gift (birth to 3T) and the gifts will be given to ICADV for distribution.

Membership Committee Chairman, Barbara Coveleskie, reported one new pledge, Beth Moody, Preceptor Delta Mu. The membership contest is still ongoing. There was no increase in membership reported from March 5th to June 1st so no one won the \$40.00 for that part of the contest. The next leg of the contest is June 25th to September 1st. This may be a little harder but there is still a \$40.00 prize. The overall prize is \$100.00 for increase in membership in your chapter over the eleven month period (September 15th to August 15th) this might be just a little bit easier to reach. If your chapter does qualify for the prize, someone from you chapter will need to be in attendance at Convention to receive it. Copies of the contest form will be in the minutes.

State Project Committee Chairman, Sarah Dunn reported "Night at the Races" for Indiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence (ICADV) was a success.

The Race Away from Domestic Violence on June 2nd raised \$20,000.00. The Gala is at Lucas Oil Estate on August 4th. There will be no conference this year. The ICADV Reception for Sorority is October 21st 2:00 to 4:00 pm at their headquarters. Sarah also submitted a letter requesting the continuing of ICADV as our State Project.

Lamplighters Secondary Project Committee Co-Chairmen, Janet Neu and Doris Moehlenkamp reported the balance as of May 18, 2018 was \$4,234.36. Total donations were \$587.45, and there were no disbursements. This brings the total savings to \$4,821.81 plus \$8.15 in the checking account for an ending balance of \$4,829.96. A copy of this report will be in the minutes mailing.

Website Committee Chairman, Theresa Stites reported, she and Nadine Cota have listed items the website needs to keep everyone informed. The committees need to get the information to the website, so they don't have to wonder who to go to for the information. They also came up with a suggested time line for this information to be included on the website.

Budget & Advisory Committees: These two committees were asked to come up with some ideas that might help the Council's budget. Linda Smith asked the committees to answer some questions. It was decided that it would be a good idea to ask the membership to input their ideas. Linda will see that the questionnaire is sent to the membership. Here are some of the questions: What ways do you think the events need to change to survive? What should definitely stay the same? What can go? If the number of events were changed, which should be dropped? Your thoughts/questions.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Parliamentarian Yvonne Nace read the By-Laws concerning election of officers and the Article V, Section 1, Meetings, as it was rewritten. This was submitted by Debbie Norris of Terre Haute, IN. It reads as follows: **There shall be three Council meetings a year: State Council Day, State Day and State Convention. State Council Day shall be held in Indianapolis or surrounding/touching counties, (Boone, Hamilton, Hancock, Hendricks, Johnson, Morgan, Shelby) each year on the first Sunday in March with various cities being hostesses. The place of meeting for State Day and State Convention shall be determined by the State Council voting members. Bids for all State meetings shall be determined by majority vote at State Convention.**

A discussion followed the reading. Pros and Cons were discussed. The motion was made by Bea Smith, seconded by Myra Albrecht to accept the motion as amended. By-Law change will be voted on at Convention.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Lynn Anderson received a letter from Sarah Dunn, State Project Chairman. IN the letter, Sarah stated the reasons why we should keep ICADV as our State Project. This will be presented and voted on by the membership at State Convention. There were no other suggestions made.



3. DO NOT IN ANY WAY MENTION THE NUMBER OF YEARS YOUR CANDIDATE HAS BEEN IN SORORITY.
4. DO NOT MENTION YOUR CANDIDATE'S OUTSIDE ACTIVITIES: I.E. CHURCH, SCHOOL, CLUBS, OR HER FAMILY LIFE.
5. DO NOT use your candidate's NAME, CITY, OR CHAPTER, except on the form below.
6. The candidate should bring a hat and white gloves to Convention. She will be seated at the head table for Sunday Brunch if she is selected State Woman of the Year. IF FOR SOME REASON SHE CANNOT ATTEND, a sister of her choice may accept for her. PLEASE NOTIFY THE STATE VICE PRESIDENT AT THE STATE REGISTRATION TABLE IF YOUR CANDIDATE IS NOT ATTENDING.
